Answers and Explanations:

1. The correct answer is **C. Hospital**;
In some rural areas of Utah, fire and police departments may not have someone at the station all of the time. The safest place to drop-off a newborn is at a hospital.
2. The correct answer is **A. True**;
The Utah Newborn Safe Haven Law states that anyone dropping off a newborn at a hospital will not be arrested.
3. The correct answer is **B. False**;
You will not have to give your name or your address to any health care provider if you drop off the newborn at a hospital.
4. The correct answer is **A. True**;
Once the newborn has had a health check at the hospital, the baby is then taken to a foster care family and the process for adoption begins right away.
